Oral Judgment (Per Sunil B. Shukre, J)

- 1. Heard learned counsel for the parties. Rule. Heard forthwith by consent of parties.
- 2. The ground relied upon by the petitioners for issuance of direction to respondent no. 1 Committee regarding grant of validity of the petitioner is that their father viz Arun Nagorao Doitare has been granted validity as they belonging to "Mana" scheduled tribe by the respondent no. 1 Scrutiny Committee on 2.4.2008. There is no dispute about grant of validity to the blood relation of the petitioner and, therefore, going by the settled principle of law, we see no reason as to why the petition should not be allowed.
- 3. Writ Petitions are allowed. The impugned orders are hereby



quashed and set aside. It is directed that respondent no. 1 Committee shall issue validity certificate to the petitioners as they belonging to "Mana" Scheduled Tribe, within four weeks from the date of receipt of the order.

- 4. Rule is made absolute in the above terms. No costs.
